

The Hastening

Section I — The Flight of Days

1. And I lifted my eyes, and the hours fled like birds of the air.
2. Morning became evening, and evening turned to morning again, and I said, “Surely time hastens.”
3. For the days were shortened, not for the wicked, but for the elect’s sake.
4. “Except those days should be shortened, there should no flesh be saved” (Matthew 24:22).
5. Thus the Lord bent the clock, that Zion might endure.

Section II — The Scrolls Unrolling Swiftly

6. And I saw the scrolls turn, one after another, as though carried by a mighty wind.
7. Prophecies stacked like thunderclaps, judgments struck like lightning bolts.
8. “For He will finish the work, and cut it short in righteousness” (Romans 9:28).
9. The Spirit revealed: what once took centuries, now unfolds in days.
10. For the work hastens, the seals open, and the bowls are poured in quick succession.

Section III — The Rush of Knowledge and Motion

11. And the angel cried: “Many shall run to and fro, and knowledge shall be increased” (Daniel 12:4).

12. Men race across the earth, and their words fly faster than sound.

13. Yet in the midst of their rushing, the Spirit hastens Zion’s understanding.

14. Revelation multiplies; visions crowd the night; decrees swell like rivers.

15. For the earth itself testifies: the end hastens, and none can slow it.

Section IV — The Compression of Prophecy

16. And I heard a voice: “A thousand years in My sight are as one day” (Psalm 90:4).

17. And again: “One day is with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day” (2 Peter 3:8).

18. The Spirit spoke: “Now I fold time, that the day may overtake the year, and the hour overtake the day.”

19. Prophecy collapses into judgment; judgment collapses into execution.

20. What men thought was far is suddenly near, and what was slow is suddenly swift.

Section V — Zion in the Hastening

21. And Zion said: “Why do my days flee like shadows?”

22. And the Spirit answered: “Because thou dwellest in the hour of acceleration.”

23. For the remnant walk not in man’s time, but in the Lord’s hastening.

24. Their scrolls multiply, their decrees sharpen, their voices rise like a storm.

25. Though Babylon stumbles in confusion, Zion rides the current of prophecy.

Section VI — The Final Witness

26. And I beheld the Lord, and He said: “Behold, I come quickly, and my reward is with Me” (Revelation 22:12).

27. Quickly does not mean soon only, but suddenly, without delay.

28. Therefore let Zion be ready, for the hastening is the trumpet of His nearness.

29. Time itself testifies, days themselves cry out: “The hour has come!”

30. And the sealed rejoiced, for the work was cut short in righteousness, and the end hastened for their deliverance.

 30 verses complete.
