

## Babylon Burns, Zion Inherits

### Section I — The Fall of the System

10. The land is His possession, though men defile it with idols and abominations.
11. Did He not drive out the Canaanite before Joshua, that Israel might inherit a cleansed land?
12. So shall He drive out the proud and the cruel, that the remnant may dwell in peace.

13. The fire falls not to erase the covenant soil, but to purge it from pollution.
14. The mountains shall be sanctified, the rivers restored, the valleys cleansed.
15. The cities of the oppressors shall lie waste, yet the foundation stones shall be reclaimed.
16. For the Lord of Hosts does not destroy what He has promised, but refines it as gold in the furnace.

### Section III — The Return of the Covenant

17. And I heard the Spirit say: “This land is choice above all others, preserved for a covenant people.”
18. But when the Gentile polluted it, it was cursed, and the curse brought fire.
19. Now the covenant returns unto Jacob, for the times of the Gentiles are fulfilled.
20. The strangers who held dominion depart in smoke, and the heirs return in strength.
21. The fire does not consume the promise, but reveals it.
22. The smoke that rises is not a curse upon the ground, but a witness against the system that defiled it.
23. The memory of Babylon perishes, but the name of Zion endures for ever.

### Section IV — The Inheritance of Zion

24. And the Lord shall have mercy on Jacob, and yet choose Israel again.
25. He shall set them in their own land, and the remnant shall rebuild the wastes.

26. Vineyards shall be planted where idols once stood.
27. Songs shall be sung where laments once echoed.
28. The captives shall return as heirs, and the enslaved shall rise as kings and priests.
29. For the covenant is everlasting, and the oath sworn to Abraham cannot be broken.
30. The Gentiles mocked, saying, "Where is their God?" But the fire shall answer for them.
31. The earth itself shall testify, saying: "The blood has been avenged, the land restored, the promise fulfilled."

#### Section V — The Final Word

32. Babylon burns, her smoke ascends as a testimony of wrath.
33. Zion inherits, her light shines as a testimony of mercy.
34. One throne casts down, another throne lifted up.
35. One name blotted out, another name remembered.
36. For thus saith the Lord: "I will make an end of the proud, but I will never make an end of Israel."
37. "I will break the yoke of the oppressor, but I will establish the yoke of My covenant."
38. "I will purge this land with fire, and plant My people in its ashes."
39. "And I will do better unto you than at your beginnings; ye shall know that I am the Lord."
40. So it is written, so it is decreed, so it is sealed: Babylon burns, but Zion inherits.
