The Character of a Kingdom King

The Kingly Mantle is measured by stewardship before authority.

A faithful king develops:

Wisdom

Integrity

Justice

Humility

Faithfulness

Courage

Discernment

Self-Control

A righteous king understands that authority is never given for personal gain.

Authority is entrusted for faithful service.

A Kingdom leader governs themselves before governing others.

They lead by example.

They protect before they command.

They serve before they are served.

The Fruit That Strengthens the Kingly Mantle

Every mantle is strengthened by the Fruit of the Spirit.

The Kingly Mantle especially depends upon:

Self-Control — governing oneself before leading others.

Faithfulness — remaining loyal to the Father's government.

Goodness — exercising authority with righteousness.

Peace — establishing order without oppression.

Without fruit...

Authority becomes pride.

Leadership becomes control.

Government becomes oppression.

With fruit...

Leadership becomes stewardship.

Justice becomes mercy.

Authority becomes service.

The fruit protects the mantle.

The Armor That Protects the Kingly Mantle

Every Kingdom function requires spiritual protection.

The Kingly Mantle is especially strengthened by the Breastplate of Righteousness.

Righteousness guards the heart of the leader.

Without righteousness, authority becomes corruption.

With righteousness, every decision reflects the character of the King of Kings.
