The Government of the Priestly Mantle

The Character of a Kingdom Priest

The Priestly Mantle is measured by consecration before position.

A faithful priest develops:

Holiness

Humility

The Fruit That Strengthens the Priestly Mantle

Faithfulness — remaining steadfast in prayer and devotion.

Love — ministering with compassion toward both the Father and His people.

Peace — carrying the Father's presence into difficult situations.

Gentleness — restoring hearts with grace and humility.

Worship becomes performance.

Service becomes obligation.

With fruit...

Every act of ministry becomes an offering pleasing to the Most High.

The fruit protects the mantle.

The Armor That Protects the Priestly Mantle

Every Kingdom function requires spiritual protection.

The Priestly Mantle is especially strengthened by the Helmet of Salvation.

The priest continually ministers in spiritual matters and must keep the mind fixed upon the promises of the Most High.

The Helmet of Salvation protects the priest from discouragement, deception, pride, and spiritual fatigue.

A faithful priest remembers that ministry flows from identity in the Father, not from personal achievement.
