Kindness notices burdens.

Kindness responds to needs.

The servant often sees what others overlook.

 Hidden Fruit

 Patience

This fruit is often overlooked.

Service can be repetitive.

People can be difficult.

Growth can be slow.

Patience allows the servant to continue helping without becoming weary.
