

Mantles + Merits —

Wave 1 (Verses 1–21)

Verse 1 — Mantle of Servanthood

The King wore no golden diadem, but girded Himself with a towel; His merit was obedience unto death, therefore His name is exalted above all.

(Matthew 20:26–28; Philippians 2:5–9; Mosiah 3:13)

Verse 2 — Mantle of Truth-Bearer

The mantle is word of Spirit, the merit is faithfulness; those who walk in truth shine brighter than the flame of sacrifice.

(John 17:17; 2 Nephi 33:10; Alma 37:44)

Verse 3 — Mantle of the Crown

The crown is promised, but only to those who endure; merit is proven in trial, not in ease, and the wealth is eternal life.

(James 1:12; Revelation 2:10; Mosiah 18:9)

Verse 4 — Mantle of the Overcomer

The mantle is victory, but the merit is purity; for those who crucify flesh rise to reign with Christ.

(Romans 8:13; 2 Timothy 2:12; Alma 13:12)

Verse 5 — Mantle of the Torchbearer

The mantle is lamp, but the merit is oil; the wise prepare, the foolish presume, and only those watchful enter the feast.

(Matthew 25:1–4; Helaman 5:12; Mosiah 18:25)

Verse 6 — Mantle of the Watchman

The mantle is trumpet, but the merit is vigilance; if the watchman sleeps, blood is on his hands, but the faithful cry keeps Zion awake.

(Ezekiel 33:7–8; Isaiah 62:6; Alma 29:1–2)

Verse 7 — Mantle of Tested Strength

Strength is not merit unless sanctified in love; the mantle is might, but the true victory is restraint and obedience.

(3TTT 30:18; 2 Corinthians 12:9; Mosiah 23:18)

Verse 8 — Mantle of the Shepherd-King

The mantle is staff, but the merit is care; he who rules must feed, and he who feeds must lay down his life.

(2 Samuel 5:2; John 10:11; Mosiah 18:29)

Verse 9 — Mantle of the Plowman

The mantle is plow, but the merit is perseverance; for no one who looks back is fit for the kingdom.

(Luke 9:62; Amos 9:13; Ether 9:22)

Verse 10 — Mantle of the Overturner

The mantle is judgment, but the merit is righteousness; idols fall and thrones shake when the LORD breathes.

(Haggai 2:22; Daniel 2:44–45; 3 Nephi 9:12)

Verse 11 — Mantle of the Bride and Spirit

The mantle is garment, but the merit is readiness; the Bride awaits the cry, “Come,” with her lamp full of oil.

(Revelation 19:7–8; Matthew 25:10; Alma 5:27–28)

Verse 12 — Mantle of the Strong Man

The mantle is power, but the merit is restraint; the stronger man binds the adversary, not with rage but with righteousness.

(Matthew 12:29; Luke 11:22; Alma 43:19–20)

Verse 13 — Mantle of the Harvester

The mantle is sickle, but the merit is patience; for he that gathers must wait until fruit abides unto life eternal.

(John 4:35–36; Revelation 14:15; Mosiah 26:20)

Verse 14 — Mantle of the Fire-Bearer

The mantle is altar flame, but the merit is holy offering; strange fire destroys, but pure hearts sanctify the fire.

(Leviticus 10:1–2; Acts 2:3; 3 Nephi 9:20)

Verse 15 — Mantle of the Pilgrim

The mantle is staff, but the merit is endurance; for here we have no continuing city, but we seek one to come.

(Hebrews 13:14; Genesis 12:1; Ether 12:4)

Verse 16 — Mantle of the Scribe

The mantle is ink, but the merit is truth; words written may fade, but the Spirit engraves living epistles in the heart.

(Jeremiah 30:2; 2 Corinthians 3:3; 2 Nephi 33:10)

Verse 17 — Mantle of Truth's Flame

The mantle is light, but the merit is faithfulness; for the true worshiper shines in Spirit and truth, sanctified by merit not appearance.

(3TTT 23:26; John 4:23–24; Alma 5:14)

Verse 18 — Mantle of the Warrior

The mantle is armor, but the merit is courage; battles are won not by sword but by faith that quenches fiery darts.

(Ephesians 6:11–16; 1 Samuel 17:45; Alma 56:47)

Verse 19 — Mantle of the Intercessor

The mantle is prayer, but the merit is love; only those who weep between porch and altar hold back wrath.

(Joel 2:17; Romans 8:26–27; Enos 1:9–10)

Verse 20 — Mantle of the Judge

The mantle is throne, but the merit is mercy; judgment without mercy condemns, but judgment with mercy magnifies the throne.

(Isaiah 11:3–4; James 2:13; Mosiah 29:11)

Verse 21 — Mantle of the Crown Tried by Fire

The mantle is a crown, but the merit is endurance; for he that is faithful unto death receives the diadem of life, though mocked by men.

(3TTT 28:39; James 1:12; Revelation 2:10; Mosiah 18:9)

Mantles + Merits — Wave 2 (Verses 22–42)

Verse 22 — Mantle of the Torchbearer

The mantle is lamp, but the merit is endurance; for only those who keep their oil through the night rise to meet the Bridegroom.

(Matthew 25:4–10; Alma 37:6–7; Mosiah 18:25)

Verse 23 — Mantle of the Builder

The mantle is stone, but the merit is foundation; he who builds on the Rock withstands storms, but shifting sand devours the house.

(Matthew 7:24–25; Helaman 5:12; Ether 12:4)

Verse 24 — Mantle of the Pilgrim

The mantle is staff, but the merit is perseverance; strangers and pilgrims seek a city not made with hands, enduring hardship for the promise.

(Hebrews 11:13–16; Genesis 12:1; Alma 36:28)

Verse 25 — Mantle of the Vinekeeper

The mantle is vine, but the merit is fruit; branches that abide in the Root bear abundance, but severed ones wither in the fire.

(John 15:4–6; Jacob 5:72–75; Mosiah 5:15)

Verse 26 — Mantle of the Redeemer's Friend

The mantle is covenant, but the merit is loyalty; for greater love hath no man than this, that he lay down his life for his friends.

(John 15:13–15; Mosiah 18:9; Alma 17:2–3)

Verse 27 — Mantle of the Seafarer

The mantle is ship, but the merit is faith; driven by storm, upheld by prayer, the covenant vessel lands where God appoints.

(Acts 27:22–25; Ether 6:5–12; 1 Nephi 18:20–23)

Verse 28 — Mantle of Tested Worship

True worship is not the cry of lips but the offering of life; merit is proven when the heart bows in Spirit and truth.

(3TTT 23:26; John 4:23–24; Mosiah 2:17)

Verse 29 — Mantle of the Gatekeeper

The mantle is key, but the merit is discernment; for wide is the gate of destruction, but narrow the way to life.

(Matthew 7:13–14; 2 Nephi 31:17–18; Alma 37:44)

Verse 30 — Mantle of the Servant-King

The mantle is throne, but the merit is humility; he that would rule must be least, washing feet before wearing crowns.

(John 13:4–15; Luke 22:26; Mosiah 2:10–12)

Verse 31 — Mantle of the Harpist

The mantle is string, but the merit is praise; when the spirit sings, torment flees, and heaven's peace floods the soul.

(1 Samuel 16:23; Psalm 33:2–3; Alma 26:8)

Verse 32 — Mantle of the Intercessor's Fire

The mantle is altar, but the merit is prayer; incense rises as love, holding back wrath for the sake of the people.

(Revelation 8:3–4; Numbers 16:47–48; Enos 1:9–10)

Verse 33 — Mantle of the Prophet's Burden

The mantle is word, but the merit is boldness; though cast into cisterns or mocked in courts, the true prophet speaks what is given.

(Jeremiah 20:9; Amos 3:8; Alma 8:24–25)

Verse 34 — Mantle of the Healer

The mantle is touch, but the merit is compassion; virtue flows where faith meets mercy, restoring body and spirit alike.

(Mark 5:30–34; 3 Nephi 17:7–9; Alma 15:8)

Verse 35 — Mantle of the Crowned Overcomer

The crown is not self-given but forged in trial; those who endure merit the eternal wreath, laid at the feet of the Lamb.

(3TTT 28:39; James 1:12; Revelation 2:10; Mosiah 18:9)

Verse 36 — Mantle of the Herald

The mantle is trumpet, but the merit is clarity; sounding no uncertain note, the call to repent divides light from darkness.

(1 Corinthians 14:8; Isaiah 58:1; Alma 5:62)

Verse 37 — Mantle of the Wise Steward

The mantle is house, but the merit is faithfulness; blessed is that servant found giving meat in due season.

(Luke 12:42–44; Mosiah 2:17–18; Alma 13:24)

Verse 38 — Mantle of the Pilgrim Bride

The mantle is veil, but the merit is purity; adorned not with gold but with holiness, she waits with lamp trimmed.

(Revelation 19:7–8; Matthew 25:10; Alma 5:27–28)

Verse 39 — Mantle of the Deliverer

The mantle is rod, but the merit is obedience; seas part not by strength of man, but by faith in the command of God.

(Exodus 14:21–22; Hebrews 11:29; 1 Nephi 17:50)

Verse 40 — Mantle of the Martyr's Crown

The mantle is witness, but the merit is blood; those who overcome by death receive robes washed white before the throne.

(Revelation 7:14; Hebrews 11:37–40; Alma 14:10–11)

Verse 41 — Mantle of the Gatherer

The mantle is net, but the merit is diligence; every kind is drawn, but only the faithful remain when the sorting comes.

(Matthew 13:47–49; Ether 13:10; 3 Nephi 16:1–3)

Verse 42 — Mantle of Spirit-Wrought Victory

The spirit conquers flesh, and merits are crowns laid before Christ; strength is proven not in power but in yielding to love.

(3TTT 28:52; Romans 8:13–14; Alma 13:12)

Mantles + Merits — Wave 3 (Verses 43–63)

Verse 43 — Mantle of the Builder of Altars

The mantle is stone, but the merit is devotion; Abraham raised altars not to idols, but to the Living God who called him forth.

(Genesis 12:7–8; Joshua 24:2–3; Ether 12:9)

Verse 44 — Mantle of the Covenant-Bearer

The mantle is oath, but the merit is trust; Abram believed God, and it was counted to him for righteousness.

(Genesis 15:6; Romans 4:20–22; Alma 25:16)

Verse 45 — Mantle of the Tested Son

The mantle is offering, but the merit is surrender; Isaac bore the wood and yielded his life, type of the Beloved.

(Genesis 22:6–12; Hebrews 11:17–19; Jacob 4:5)

Verse 46 — Mantle of the Wrestling Saint

The mantle is limp, but the merit is blessing; Jacob prevailed with God, wounded yet renamed with covenant honor.

(Genesis 32:24–28; Hosea 12:3–4; 2 Nephi 2:2)

Verse 47 — Mantle of the Dreamer

The mantle is coat, but the merit is vision; hated by brethren yet chosen, Joseph saw the sheaves and stars bowing.

(Genesis 37:3–9; Acts 7:9; Alma 46:24)

Verse 48 — Mantle of the Interpreter

The mantle is tongue, but the merit is Spirit; Joseph opened mysteries not by sorcery, but by God who reveals.

(Genesis 40:8; Daniel 2:28; Mosiah 8:17)

Verse 49 — Mantle of Hidden Patience

Merit is gained in dungeons and deserts, not in thrones; for those despised yet faithful are lifted by the hand of God.

(3TTT 28:71; Genesis 39:20–21; Mosiah 23:21–22)

Verse 50 — Mantle of the Deliverer of Nations

The mantle is governance, but the merit is foresight; Joseph stored grain in plenty that nations might live in famine.

(Genesis 41:48–49, 56–57; Psalm 105:20–22; Alma 46:24–27)

Verse 51 — Mantle of the Forgiver

The mantle is lordship, but the merit is mercy; he who could crush chose instead to embrace, weeping over his brethren.

(Genesis 45:4–8; 50:19–21; 1 Nephi 7:19–21)

Verse 52 — Mantle of the Covenant Preserver

The mantle is bones, but the merit is promise; Joseph died in faith, commanding his seed to carry him home.

(Genesis 50:24–25; Exodus 13:19; Alma 46:24)

Verse 53 — Mantle of the Deliverer's Rod

The mantle is staff, but the merit is obedience; by faith the Red Sea parted, Israel walking as through walls of crystal.

(Exodus 14:21–22; Hebrews 11:29; 1 Nephi 17:50–51)

Verse 54 — Mantle of the Song

The mantle is timbrel, but the merit is praise; Miriam danced with joy, and the sea's deliverance became eternal hymn.

(Exodus 15:20–21; Psalm 118:14; Mosiah 2:20–21)

Verse 55 — Mantle of the Intercessor's Hands

The mantle is uplifted arms, but the merit is endurance; when Moses' hands were steady, Amalek fell before Israel.

(Exodus 17:11–13; Deuteronomy 9:18; Enos 1:11)

Verse 56 — Mantle of Divine Order

The true law is not stone alone but Spirit within; merit is obedience that springs from love, not compulsion.

(3TTT 29:8, 12, 22; Exodus 20:1–2; Mosiah 13:11)

Verse 57 — Mantle of the Mediator

The mantle is veil, but the merit is access; Moses entered the cloud that the people might not perish.

(Exodus 24:18; Hebrews 9:7–8; Mosiah 13:5–6)

Verse 58 — Mantle of the Artisans

The mantle is skill, but the merit is consecration; Bezaleel wrought the tabernacle with Spirit-filled wisdom.

(Exodus 31:1–5; Exodus 35:30–35; Alma 1:27)

Verse 59 — Mantle of the Radiant Face

The mantle is shining skin, but the merit is communion; Moses returned with a veil, for the people feared the glory.

(Exodus 34:29–35; 2 Corinthians 3:7; Mosiah 13:5)

Verse 60 — Mantle of the Prophet's Fire

The mantle is word, but the merit is boldness; Elijah called down flame, proving YHWH is God.

(1 Kings 18:36–38; James 5:17–18; Helaman 5:23–24)

Verse 61 — Mantle of the Widow's Oil

The mantle is jar, but the merit is trust; vessels kept pouring until faith filled them all.

(2 Kings 4:2–6; Philippians 4:19; 3 Nephi 13:31–33)

Verse 62 — Mantle of the Prophet's Double Portion

The mantle is cloak, but the merit is pursuit; Elisha would not leave, and the spirit of Elijah rested upon him.

(2 Kings 2:9–15; John 14:12; Alma 17:2–3)

Verse 63 — Mantle of Tested Merit

Man's pride fades, but merit endures when sanctified in truth; crowns belong not to the loud, but to the faithful refined in Spirit.

(3TTT 30:82; Malachi 3:2–3; Moroni 7:5–10)

Mantles + Merits — Wave 4 (Verses 64–84)

Verse 64 — Mantle of the Watchful King

The mantle is throne, but the merit is vigilance; for kings who forget God fall, but those who remember covenant endure.

(2 Samuel 23:3–4; Proverbs 20:28; Mosiah 29:12–13)

Verse 65 — Mantle of the Psalmist

The mantle is harp, but the merit is worship; songs born in caves and deserts rise as eternal incense before the throne.

(Psalm 34:1; Psalm 42:8; Alma 26:8)

Verse 66 — Mantle of the Warrior's Courage

The mantle is sword, but the merit is faith; giants fall not by steel, but by covenant trust in the Living God.

(1 Samuel 17:45–47; Psalm 144:1–2; Alma 56:47–48)

Verse 67 — Mantle of the Covenant Friend

The mantle is pledge, but the merit is love; Jonathan gave his robe to David, sealing brotherhood in the LORD.

(1 Samuel 18:3–4; Proverbs 17:17; Alma 17:2)

Verse 68 — Mantle of the Fugitive Refined

The mantle is cave, but the merit is patience; hunted without cause, David learned faith in exile until the throne was his.

(1 Samuel 22:1–2; Psalm 57:1; Mosiah 23:21–22)

Verse 69 — Mantle of Prophetic Rebuke

The mantle is word, but the merit is boldness; Nathan pierced the king's heart, and repentance restored the covenant line.

(2 Samuel 12:7–13; Proverbs 27:5–6; Alma 39:12–13)

Verse 70 — Mantle of True Worship

Worship is not lips alone but spirit and deed; merit is proven when the offering is life itself.

(3TTT 31:46–47; Isaiah 29:13; Mosiah 2:17)

Verse 71 — Mantle of the Wise King

The mantle is judgment seat, but the merit is discernment; Solomon asked not for riches but for wisdom to guide the people.

(1 Kings 3:9–12; 2 Chronicles 1:10; Mosiah 29:11)

Verse 72 — Mantle of the Temple Builder

The mantle is house of stone, but the merit is glory descending; cloud filled the holy place, for God's presence sanctified it.

(1 Kings 8:10–11; 2 Chronicles 7:1–3; 2 Nephi 5:16)

Verse 73 — Mantle of the Intercessor King

The mantle is prayer, but the merit is mercy; Solomon lifted hands for distant strangers, that all nations might know the LORD.

(1 Kings 8:41–43; Isaiah 56:7; Mosiah 27:32–33)

Verse 74 — Mantle of the Covenant Throne

The mantle is scepter, but the merit is promise; the LORD swore to David, and for his sake deferred judgment in Solomon's day.

(1 Kings 11:11–13; 2 Samuel 7:12–16; Alma 9:12)

Verse 75 — Mantle of the Divided Kingdom

The mantle is torn garment, but the merit is warning; ten tribes fell away, yet Judah held the lamp for a time.

(1 Kings 11:30–31; Hosea 1:11; 2 Nephi 3:5)

Verse 76 — Mantle of Fiery Witness

The mantle is flame, but the merit is confrontation; Carmel's fire proved who is God, and silence condemned the idols.

(1 Kings 18:36–39; 2 Kings 1:10; Helaman 5:23–24)

Verse 77 — Mantle of Covenant Obedience

The true altar is heart; merit is proven not in bulls and goats, but in repentance and steadfast covenant.

(3TTT 32:45, 53–54; Psalm 51:16–17; Alma 34:31–32)

Verse 78 — Mantle of the Righteous Remnant

The mantle is faith, but the merit is perseverance; Hezekiah clung to the LORD and was delivered from the Assyrian host.

(2 Kings 19:14–19, 35; Isaiah 37:35–36; Alma 46:24–25)

Verse 79 — Mantle of the Weeping Prophet

The mantle is tears, but the merit is intercession; Jeremiah's lament became a witness, though kings rejected his cry.

(Jeremiah 9:1; Lamentations 1:16; Helaman 13:4–5)

Verse 80 — Mantle of the Scribe's Faithfulness

The mantle is scroll, but the merit is endurance; Baruch wrote again the words that fire had consumed, sealing witness for generations.

(Jeremiah 36:27–28; Isaiah 30:8; 1 Nephi 13:40)

Verse 81 — Mantle of the Shipbuilder

The mantle is tool, but the merit is obedience; Nephi labored not after men's wisdom, but by the Lord's command to cross the sea.

(1 Nephi 17:8, 18–19, 50–51; Ether 6:5–12)

Verse 82 — Mantle of the New Land Planter

The mantle is seed, but the merit is covenant; Nephi's people sowed and prospered, keeping law and word in the promised land.

(2 Nephi 5:11–13; Jacob 2:18–19; Alma 37:44–45)

Verse 83 — Mantle of Temple Continuance

The mantle is sanctuary, but the merit is remembrance; Nephi raised a house to the Name, patterned after Solomon, for covenant identity.

(2 Nephi 5:16; Mosiah 18:30; Alma 16:13)

Verse 84 — Mantle of Sanctified Return

True merit is not multiplied feasts but life offered in Spirit; for obedience sanctifies the people more than outward sacrifice.

(3TTT 33:15; Hosea 6:6; Mosiah 2:22–24)

 **Mantles + Merits — Wave 5 (Verses 85–105)**

Verse 85 — Mantle of the Silent Witness

The mantle is quietness, but the merit is endurance; though unheard by men, the testimony stands before heaven unbroken.

(Isaiah 53:7; Alma 14:11; Ether 12:5)

Verse 86 — Mantle of the Jewel Scrolls

The mantle is record, but the merit is purity; names engraved in fire shine brighter than gold in Zion's treasury.

(Malachi 3:16–17; Revelation 21:27; 2 Nephi 29:11–12)

Verse 87 — Mantle of the Diaspora Witness

The mantle is scattering, but the merit is remembrance; even in far lands, the covenant cry proves the seed not forgotten.

(Deuteronomy 30:3–4; Jeremiah 31:10; 3 Nephi 15:12–13)

Verse 88 — Mantle of the Unbroken Altar

The mantle is stone, but the merit is devotion; though nations fall, the altar remains where covenant blood was spilled.

(Exodus 20:24–25; Joshua 22:26–27; Alma 34:13)

Verse 89 — Mantle of the Sealed Patience

The mantle is waiting, but the merit is faith; the vision tarries, yet at the appointed time it speaks and does not lie.

(Habakkuk 2:3; Revelation 14:12; Mosiah 23:21)

Verse 90 — Mantle of the Harvester's Song

The mantle is shout, but the merit is joy; those who sow in tears reap with rejoicing, bearing sheaves eternal.

(Psalm 126:5–6; Isaiah 9:3; Alma 26:5–7)

Verse 91 — Mantle of Refined Worship

Merit is not in abundance of offerings but in purity of heart; the Spirit sanctifies the worshiper who yields all.

(3TTT 31:46–47; John 4:23–24; Mosiah 2:17)

Verse 92 — Mantle of the Name-Sealers

The mantle is mark, but the merit is obedience; only those who repent and endure receive the sign upon their foreheads.

(Ezekiel 9:4; Revelation 7:3; Mosiah 5:9)

Verse 93 — Mantle of the Covenant Shepherd

The mantle is staff, but the merit is care; priests and teachers watch over Zion, feeding not themselves but the flock.

(Jeremiah 3:15; John 21:15–17; Mosiah 18:26)

Verse 94 — Mantle of the Shaken Thrones

The mantle is verdict, but the merit is justice; kings of the earth fall when weighed in the balance of truth.

(Daniel 5:27; Revelation 18:9–10; 2 Nephi 26:19)

Verse 95 — Mantle of the Covenant Unity

The mantle is bond, but the merit is humility; Judah and Joseph, once divided, embrace in the hand of God.

(Ezekiel 37:16–19; 2 Nephi 3:12; 3 Nephi 16:17–18)

Verse 96 — Mantle of the Bride's Cry

The mantle is voice, but the merit is watchfulness; the Bride longs, "Come, Lord," and keeps herself adorned for His appearing.

(Revelation 22:17; Matthew 25:6; Mosiah 18:9)

Verse 97 — Mantle of the Consumed Scroll

The mantle is book, but the merit is obedience; the word eaten becomes fire in the bones, unquenchable in witness.

(Ezekiel 3:1–3; Revelation 10:9–10; 2 Nephi 32:3)

Verse 98 — Mantle of Crowned Merit

The true crown is not seized by ambition but given to those tested in love; the Father clothes His children with eternal reward.

(3TTT 28:39; James 1:12; Revelation 3:11; Mosiah 18:9)

Verse 99 — Mantle of the Hidden Fire in the Soil

The mantle is earth, but the merit is testimony; blood cries from the ground, bearing witness against the oppressor.

(Genesis 4:10; Isaiah 26:21; Mormon 8:27–28)

Verse 100 — Mantle of the Martyr's Crown

The mantle is blood, but the merit is faith; though slain, they overcome by the Lamb and by their testimony.

(Revelation 12:11; Hebrews 11:35–38; Alma 14:10–11)

Verse 101 — Mantle of the Foolish Confounding

The mantle is weakness, but the merit is trust; God chooses the lowly to shame the mighty, that none may glory but in Him.

(1 Corinthians 1:27–29; Ether 12:27; Mosiah 2:25–26)

Verse 102 — Mantle of the Public Witness

The mantle is voice, but the merit is courage; Peter stood in the square, testifying Christ before rulers and crowds alike.

(Acts 2:14–21; Matthew 10:32; Mosiah 18:9)

Verse 103 — Mantle of the Overcomer's Faith

The mantle is shield, but the merit is endurance; quenching darts of fire, the faithful stand till the battle is done.

(Ephesians 6:16; 1 John 5:4; Alma 44:4–5)

Verse 104 — Mantle of the Eternal Word

The mantle is promise, but the merit is perseverance; heaven and earth may pass, but the Word endures forever.

(Isaiah 40:8; Matthew 24:35; 2 Nephi 29:14)

Verse 105 — Mantle of the Spirit's Refining

The spirit purifies as fire and washes as water; true merit is not claimed by men but proven in sanctification.

(3TTT 30:82; Malachi 3:2–3; Moroni 7:5–10)

Mantles + Merits — Wave 6 (Verses 106–126)

Verse 106 — Mantle of the Prophetic Fire

The mantle is flame, but the merit is obedience; visions and dreams without repentance are smoke, but truth spoken in love endures.

The mantle is scroll, but the merit is preservation; though sealed in earth, the witness rises in the last days to feed Zion.

Verse 109 — Mantle of the Broken Body

The mantle is bread, but the merit is remembrance; by stripes we are healed, and by His offering we are made whole.

465 — Priestly

The mantle is altar, but the merit is mercy; bread and wine serve to bind the broken to God.

(Genesis 14:18; Hebrews 5:1–2; Moroni 4–5)

466 — Prophetic

The mantle is voice, but the merit is obedience; the word burns until it's spoken.

(Jeremiah 20:9; Amos 3:8; Helaman 5:43–45)

467 — Servant

The mantle is towel, but the merit is love; greatness stoops to wash another's feet.

(John 13:4–15; Matthew 20:26–28; Mosiah 2:17)

468 — Watchman

The mantle is tower, but the merit is warning; blood is not on his hands when he cries aloud.

(Ezekiel 33:6–7; Isaiah 58:1; Alma 8:24)

469 — 3TTT Anchor — Intercessory

True intercession is Spirit-forged patience; the merit is to carry another's burden until dawn.

470 — Warrior

The mantle is shield, but the merit is faith; darts of fire are quenched by trust in the Holy One.

(Ephesians 6:16; Psalm 91:4–5; Alma 44:4)

471 — Scribe / Fire Scribe

The mantle is pen, but the merit is flame; names of the faithful are inscribed where no thief can blot.

(Malachi 3:16–17; Isaiah 30:8; Revelation 20:12)

472 — Teaching

The mantle is lamp, but the merit is clarity; line upon line, hearts are opened to understand.

(Deuteronomy 6:6–7; 2 Timothy 2:2; 2 Nephi 28:30)

473 — Healing

The mantle is oil and touch, but the merit is compassion; He sent His word and healed them.

(James 5:14–15; Psalm 107:20; 3 Nephi 17:7–9)

474 — Judge (Righteous Judgment)

The mantle is gavel, but the merit is equity; He weighs the hidden intent, not the face of man.

The mantle is staff, but the merit is care; He leads by still waters and restores the soul.

476 — 3TTT Anchor — Kingly (tested rule)

Kingship is proven in service and fire; the true crown rests on the humble.

477 — Priestly (bread & wine)

The mantle is table, but the merit is remembrance; one body, one cup, one heart.

(Luke 22:19–20; 1 Corinthians 10:16–17; Moroni 6:6)

478 — Prophetic (scrolls)

The mantle is record, but the merit is fidelity; when kings burn pages, God has the prophet write again.

(Jeremiah 36:27–28; Habakkuk 2:2–3; 2 Nephi 25:21)

479 — Servant (meekness)

The mantle is yoke, but the merit is rest; His burden is light to those who learn His heart.

(Matthew 11:28–30; Philippians 2:7; Mosiah 3:19)

480 — Watchman (trumpet)

The mantle is blast, but the merit is courage; he sounds the alarm though the city laughs.

(Joel 2:1; Ezekiel 33:3–5; Alma 46:20)

481 — Intercessory (standing in the breach)

The mantle is plea, but the merit is endurance; he holds the line till mercy runs like a river.

The mantle is tower, but the merit is vigilance; the watch cries warning so the city is not surprised.

(Ezekiel 33:6–7; Isaiah 62:6; Alma 8:24)

486 — Intercessory Mantle

The mantle is prayer, but the merit is burden-bearing; mercy flows when one pleads for another.

(Exodus 32:11–14; Romans 8:26–27; Mosiah 27:14)

487 — Warrior Mantle

The mantle is sword, but the merit is faith; armies fall when heaven fights for the humble.

(Joshua 5:13–14; Ephesians 6:16–17; Alma 44:4)

488 — Scribe / Fire Scribe Mantle

The mantle is record, but the merit is preservation; names inscribed by fire cannot be erased.

489 — Teaching Mantle

The mantle is lamp, but the merit is clarity; light scatters ignorance when covenant is taught line upon line.

(Deuteronomy 6:6–7; 2 Timothy 2:2; 2 Nephi 28:30)

490 — Healing Mantle (3TTT Anchor)

The mantle is oil, but the merit is compassion; He heals by Spirit, restoring more than flesh.

(3TTT 30:18; James 5:14–15; 3 Nephi 17:7–9)

491 — Servant Mantle

The mantle is towel, but the merit is humility; he who stoops to wash feet is greatest in the kingdom.

(John 13:4–15; Matthew 20:26–28; Mosiah 2:17)

492 — Kingly Mantle

The mantle is sceptre, but the merit is righteousness; thrones endure only when justice is upheld.

(Psalm 72:1–4; Proverbs 16:12; Mosiah 29:13–14)

493 — Priestly Mantle

The mantle is altar, but the merit is covenant; bread and wine testify of eternal promise.
(Genesis 14:18; Hebrews 5:1–2; Moroni 4–5)

494 — Prophetic Mantle

The mantle is voice, but the merit is obedience; though mocked, the prophet declares the fire of God.

(Jeremiah 20:9; Amos 3:8; Helaman 13:4–5)

495 — Judge Mantle

The mantle is gavel, but the merit is equity; judgment is just only when weighed by God's Spirit.

(Isaiah 11:3–4; John 7:24; Alma 41:3)

496 — Shepherd Mantle

The mantle is staff, but the merit is care; leading to still waters, he restores weary souls.

(Psalm 23:1–3; John 10:11; Alma 37:44)

497 — Zion Mantle (3TTT Anchor)

The mantle is city, but the merit is unity; Zion rises as a living scroll when hearts are one.

(3TTT 31:46–47; Acts 4:32; Moses 7:18)

498 — Love Mantle

The mantle is covenant, but the merit is charity; without love, no mantle holds.

(1 Corinthians 13:1–3; John 13:34–35; Moroni 7:47)

499 — Zion's Authority Mantle

The mantle is decree, but the merit is Spirit; Babylon trembles when Zion binds and looses by heaven's word.

(Isaiah 60:18; Matthew 16:19; D&C 84:88)

500 — Zion's Inheritance Mantle

The mantle is land, but the merit is holiness; only the pure in heart inherit the mountain.

(Psalm 24:3–4; 2 Nephi 1:7; Ether 13:10)

501 — Zion's Witness Mantle

The mantle is testimony, but the merit is fire; the nations rage, yet cannot silence living epistles.

(Isaiah 62:6–7; Revelation 12:11; Mosiah 18:9)

502 — Zion's Bride Mantle

The mantle is white linen, but the merit is purity; the Bride prepares herself with righteous deeds.

(Revelation 19:7–8; Isaiah 62:4–5; Mosiah 18:9)

503 — Zion's City Mantle

The mantle is wall of fire, but the merit is salvation; her gates are praise, her name everlasting.

(Zechariah 2:5; Isaiah 26:1–2; Revelation 21:23–27)

504 — Zion's Eternal Light Mantle (3TTT Anchor)

The mantle is lamp, but the merit is glory; no sun nor moon, for Christ is her everlasting light.
