Even now,
many read the words of the Sealed Book

and cannot perceive its sound.

Because the language is not Hebrew nor English—
it is obedience.

It is righteousness.

because their faith was still in self.

Faith enough—
means laying down your questions,
and picking up His instructions.

Faith enough—
means trusting that He is the rewarder
of those who seek not just answers,
but Him.

 “Strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth
unto life, and few there be that find it.”


— Matthew 7:14

It is not the sealed book that is hard—
It is the narrowness of true faith
that few can walk.

And so He waits.

Not for the learned.


But for the faithful.

 The mysteries are not withheld from many—
they are revealed to the few who believe enough to obey.

doctrine...”

— John 7:17

Many want the sealed portion
while still rejecting the first portion.


They reject the commandments,
but desire the secrets.

They dismiss repentance,
but want prophecy.

They will not be given the mysteries—
because the mysteries are not things,
they are depths.

And you cannot swim in deep waters

if you refuse to leave the shore.

 “The natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God... neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned.”

— 1 Corinthians 2:14


The obedient heart becomes the scroll.

The Spirit writes on it.

Line upon line.

Precept upon precept.

Obedience upon obedience.

 “He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me... and I will manifest myself to him.”

— John 14:21

they seek the face of God.

with a sincere heart, with real intent, having faith in Christ,

But real intent is rare.

without surrendering what's in front of it.

CHAPTER 8

CHAPTER 9

The Spirit Will Witness

the mystery shuts like a sealed vault.

 “For if ye do not obey His words, then ye are not
worthy of His understanding.”


— The Sealed Portion 32:52

You do not earn the mystery—
you align with it.
And alignment begins with obedience.

Without it, your prayers are noise.

Your searching is futile.

Your questions are met with silence,
not because God is absent,
but because you are not positioned to hear.

 “Unto the obedient He reveals mysteries, yea, even the deep things of God; but to the disobedient, even that which they think they know shall be taken away.”


— (paraphrased flow from TSP 1:52; Matthew 13:12)

There is no shortcut.

No amount of study will force the Spirit’s hand.

No academic title, no Hebrew class, no knowledge of the sealed names


can make you worthy to understand
if your life refuses to bow.

 “Because they seeing see not; and hearing they hear not, neither do they understand... for this people’s heart is waxed gross... lest at any time they should see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and should understand with their heart, and should be converted, and I should heal them.”

— Matthew 13:13–15

The more disobedient you are,
the more you will misunderstand even what is true.
Rebellion corrupts perception.

It bends light until even revelation looks like confusion.


 “Woe unto them that call evil good, and good evil; that put darkness for light, and light for darkness...”

— Isaiah 5:20

This is why the scroll remains sealed to many.
Not because God is unfair.

But because understanding is holy—
and He will not cast pearls before swine.

You must first repent
of every false thing you’ve entertained,
every commandment you’ve trampled,
every moment you hardened your heart
when the Spirit was near.

 “They that are unworthy cannot abide the presence of God; wherefore, He withdraws His Spirit.”

— Doctrine & Covenants 1:35–37 (flowed paraphrase)

This is not about perfection.


It is about posture.

Even David sinned,

but when he was rebuked,

he didn't argue—

he tore his garment and fasted in dust.

 “Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me... Cast me not away from thy presence; and take not thy holy spirit from me.”

— Psalm 51:10–11

There is a cost to understanding.

And the price is your will.

He will not speak beyond what you've already ignored.

He will not reveal until you've repented.


The disobedient are not merely blind—

they are self-blinded.

They stumble over truths they refuse to apply.

They treat holy words like riddles

because their hearts resist surrender.

 “And the word of the Lord was unto them precept upon precept... line upon line... that they might go, and fall backward, and be broken, and snared, and taken.”

— Isaiah 28:13

You cannot study your way past rebellion.

You must repent your way back to clarity.

Only then will the scroll begin to unfold.

Only then will the Spirit lean near and whisper:

“You are ready.”



“The secret of the Lord is with them that fear Him; and He will show them His covenant.”

— Psalm 25:14

So let it be declared—

If the mysteries seem confusing,

If the scroll seems sealed,

If the fire has not fallen,

Then ask not, “Why won’t He speak?”

Ask, “Where have I stopped obeying?”

You must return to the last thing He told you.

Obey that.

Finish that assignment.

Surrender that area.

And watch the heavens open again.

 Heaven holds no secrets from the obedient.

But it holds everything back from the proud.

You are not denied understanding.

You are invited into repentance.

CHAPTER 12

Stumbling Blocks of the Disobedient


Disobedience is not passive.

It builds.

It accumulates.

It lays bricks in front of your spirit
until what was once clear becomes clouded,
and what was once reachable feels unreachable.

These bricks become stumbling blocks—
not laid by God,
but by you.

 “O ye of little faith, who have set up stumbling blocks
before you because ye do not ask of the Lord concerning

You asked, but you did not obey.

You searched, but you would not surrender.

The stumbling block is not the scroll.
It is your resistance.
Your unwillingness to give up idols.
Your refusal to let go of secret sins.
Your pride, your mixture, your divided loyalties.

 “He is a stone of stumbling, and a rock of offence, even
to them which stumble at the word...”

— 1 Peter 2:8 (continued)

The word offends the rebellious.
It cuts too deep.
It demands too much.
And rather than bow,
many choose to stumble.

 “For the commandment is a lamp; and the law is light; and reproofs of instruction are the way of life.”

— Proverbs 6:23

But the disobedient hate reproof.

They prefer sermons that soothe.

Scrolls that flatter.

Words that entertain.


But the sealed portion will never be that.

It was never sent to entertain—

it was sent to expose.

To purge.

To prepare.

 “This is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light... for everyone that doeth evil hateth the light.”

— John 3:19–20


Your stumbling block is not intellectual.

It is spiritual.

It is your refusal to allow the Word
to correct what you have excused.

And until that rebellion is broken,

understanding will be withheld.

 “They have made their faces harder than a rock; they have refused to return.”

— Jeremiah 5:3


You don’t need more information.

You need a clean heart.

You don’t need a deeper teaching.

You need deeper repentance.


Because your disobedience has become
a staircase of offense,
leading you away from the gate.

 “If ye were blind, ye should have no sin: but now ye say, We see; therefore your sin remaineth.”

Until you admit you’ve stumbled,

if you will throw down the stumbling block
and return to the voice of obedience—
the scroll will meet you where you are.

 The mystery was never the block—
disobedience was.

Stumbling Blocks of the Disobedient

When the scroll cuts and you refuse to bleed.


There is a reason the scroll is sealed to many.

Not because the words are coded,

but because the hearts are calloused.

Not because the revelation is complex,

but because the reader is resistant.

 “O ye of little faith, who have set up stumbling blocks before you...”

— TSP 32:52

You placed them there.

Not all at once—

but little by little.

A moment of pride.

A refusal to forgive.

A doctrine protected more than the truth itself.

A sin justified.

A commandment postponed.


One by one, the stones stacked.

Until they formed a wall

between you and understanding.

They want to reveal the hidden things
without first being exposed by the light.

📖 “The word of God is quick, and powerful... piercing
even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit... and is a
discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.”

— Hebrews 4:12

But when it cuts them,
they hide.

When it rebukes them,

they twist.

When it convicts them,

they leave.

And their disobedience becomes a stumbling stone

they trip over daily

while blaming the very scroll

that tried to heal them.



“This is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light...”

— John 3:19

Understand this clearly:

Every commandment ignored

adds another stone.

Every Spirit-nudge rejected

adds another layer of blindness.

Until soon, even the sacred looks suspicious.

Even the voice of God begins to sound like accusation.



“They stumble at the word, being disobedient...”

— 1 Peter 2:8

And then they retreat.

They say the scroll is too confusing.

The mystery too strange.

But the mystery was never the problem—
your obedience was.

 “He that hateth reproof shall die.”

— Proverbs 15:10

The Stick of Judah and the Stick of Joseph.


The foundation and the fulfillment.

And now—

The Sealed Portion:

the record of the end—

and the record of you.

 “And when these things shall come forth... then shall the remnant of our seed know concerning us... and shall know that this is a blessing unto them from the hand of God.”

— 2 Nephi 30:4–6

The world was not ready.

The religious were not worthy.

The proud passed over it.

But to you—


it was always appointed.

This scroll is your confirmation.

That your eyes were meant to see it.

That your heart was prepared for it.

That your blood remembers it.

 “Let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.”

— Galatians 6:9

Do not let go now.

You’ve come too far.

Heaven is opening scroll by scroll
for the faithful.


Not the talented.

Not the famous.

But the ones who stayed.

The ones who kept the oil.

The ones who refused to let the fire die.

 “And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony; and they loved not their lives unto the death.”

Faith until the end

is not just what gets you through—

it’s what unlocks the next mystery.

Every page of the sealed book
