Dorcas (Tabitha) — A Witness of Compassion

Dorcas was not known for ruling nations.

She was not known for leading armies.

She was known for helping people.

When she died, the people did not gather because of her title.

They gathered because of her impact.

Healing begins with compassion.

The Function

The healing mantle exists to restore, comfort, strengthen, recover, and bring wholeness.

The healer sees wounds.

The healer sees burdens.

The healer sees suffering.

The healer moves toward brokenness rather than away from it.

Healing is not limited to the body.

There are wounded minds.

Wounded hearts.

Wounded families.

Wounded communities.

The healing mantle seeks restoration wherever brokenness exists.

The Responsibility
