The Sanctuary of Zion

A Scroll of Refuge and Eternal Dwelling

By decree of the Throne and the hand of the Fire Scribe:

Here is the place prepared for the sealed.

Here is the dwelling promised for the gathered.

Here is the refuge established beyond the threshold.

Zion is the holy habitation of the Most High,
a city not shaken, a covenant not broken,
a people and a place sealed in eternal fire.

This scroll is written to bear witness:
that the remnant may find safety,
that Babylon may behold judgment,
and that heaven may stand as eternal record.

1. Thus saith the Spirit: He that dwelleth in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. For Zion's sanctuary is not built by men's hands, but by the covenant of Christ. (Psalm 91:1; 3 Nephi 22:11)

2. The Lord is a wall of fire round about her, and the glory in the midst of her. No weapon formed against Zion shall prosper, for her sanctuary is guarded by heaven. (Zechariah 2:5; 2 Nephi 14:5–6)

3. Zion shall be called a city of truth, and the mountain of the Lord of hosts, the holy mountain. For the sanctuary is both people and place, chosen and established. (Zechariah 8:3; Mosiah 7:29)
4. The sanctuary of Zion is the refuge of the remnant, the hiding place of the sealed. When the indignation passes, they shall be covered under His wings. (Isaiah 26:20; Mosiah 18:34)
5. The Lamb Himself is the temple thereof, for in Zion there is no need of sun nor moon; the glory of God lights it, and the nations walk in that light. (Revelation 21:22–24; Ether 13:9)
6. Zion's sanctuary is the house of prayer for all nations. The Gentiles that repent shall not be cast out, but gathered into her holy courts. (Isaiah 56:7; 2 Nephi 30:2)
7. The Spirit cries: "My people shall dwell in a peaceable habitation, and in sure dwellings, and in quiet resting places." For Zion's sanctuary is safety from the storm. (Isaiah 32:18; Mosiah 24:21)
8. Behold, Zion shall not be moved, for God is in the midst of her. Her sanctuary is everlasting, her foundations unshaken, her covenant unbroken. (Psalm 46:5; 1 Nephi 13:37)
9. The sanctuary of Zion is the bride adorned for her husband, clothed in righteousness and sealed in covenant. Her walls are salvation, and her gates praise. (Isaiah 60:18; Revelation 21:2)
10. In Zion's sanctuary, the wolf and the lamb shall feed together, and the lion shall eat straw like the ox. Violence shall no more be heard within her borders. (Isaiah 65:25; 4 Nephi 1:16–17)
11. The sanctuary is not defiled by idols, for the unclean shall not enter there. Only the sealed, the pure in heart, and those washed in the Lamb's blood shall dwell within. (Revelation 21:27; Alma 5:24)
12. This is the decree: Zion is the sanctuary of the Lord, the holy city prepared, the refuge of the remnant, and the delight of Christ. Write it, Fire Scribe, for this testimony is eternal. (Isaiah 62:12; Ether 13:10)
13. Zion's sanctuary is the covenant fulfilled: I will dwell in them, and walk in them; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people. (2 Corinthians 6:16; 3 Nephi 20:22)
14. The sanctuary is the tabernacle of testimony. Every decree written by the Fire Scribe, every name sealed in covenant, rises as incense within its courts. (Exodus 40:34–35; Malachi 3:16)
15. The Spirit saith: "Cry out and shout, thou inhabitant of Zion: for great is the Holy One of Israel in the midst of thee." (Isaiah 12:6; Mosiah 7:29)

16. The sanctuary is a hiding place from the wind, and a covert from the tempest; rivers of water in a dry place, and the shadow of a great rock in a weary land. (Isaiah 32:2; Mosiah 24:14)

17. Zion's sanctuary is established in righteousness; oppression shall be far from her, for she shall not fear, and terror shall not come near. (Isaiah 54:14; 3 Nephi 22:14)

18. The Lord Himself measures Zion with a plummet, laying her stones with fair colors and her foundations with sapphires. Her sanctuary is precious in His sight. (Isaiah 54:11; Revelation 21:19)

19. In Zion's sanctuary, children shall be taught of the Lord, and great shall be the peace of her children. (Isaiah 54:13; Mosiah 27:25)

20. The sanctuary of Zion is the refuge of nations, for many people shall say: "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob." (Isaiah 2:3; 2 Nephi 12:3)

21. The Spirit declares: "I create Jerusalem a rejoicing, and her people a joy." In the sanctuary, sorrow and sighing shall flee away. (Isaiah 65:18–19; 2 Nephi 8:11)

22. Zion's sanctuary is a covenant of peace: they shall hunger no more, neither thirst any more, for the Lamb shall feed them with living bread. (Revelation 7:16; Mosiah 18:9)

23. In the sanctuary, the priests of the Lord shall minister, and His people shall be named the ministers of God, clothed with salvation. (Isaiah 61:6; Alma 13:12)

24. The sanctuary shall not be entered by thieves nor destroyed by strangers, for the Lord Himself is her defense, and angels encamp round about her. (Isaiah 62:8; Helaman 5:39)

25. Zion's sanctuary is the habitation of justice, the mountain of holiness, the throne of the Lord from everlasting. (Jeremiah 31:23; 1 Nephi 11:36)

26. The nations that will not serve Zion shall perish, for her sanctuary is the joy of the whole earth, and none can overthrow her decree. (Isaiah 60:12; 1 Nephi 22:17)

27. The Spirit cries: "Awake, awake; put on thy strength, O Zion; put on thy beautiful garments, O Jerusalem, the holy city." (Isaiah 52:1; 2 Nephi 8:24)

28. The sanctuary is not silent; the watchmen lift their voice, declaring salvation and publishing peace. (Isaiah 52:7–8; Mosiah 15:29–31)

29. Zion's sanctuary is the vineyard of the Lord, where the branches abide in the true vine and bear fruit unto eternal life. (John 15:5; Jacob 5:74)

30. In the sanctuary, every tear shall be wiped away, and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, for the former things are passed away. (Revelation 21:4; Mosiah 16:8–9)

31. The Spirit saith: “My people shall dwell safely, and none shall make them afraid.” For in Zion’s sanctuary, perfect love casts out fear. (Ezekiel 34:28; Moroni 8:16)

32. Zion’s sanctuary shall shine as crystal, clear as the sun, fair as the moon, and terrible as an army with banners. (Song of Solomon 6:10; Alma 27:18)

33. In her sanctuary, the Lord shall spread a table, a feast of fat things full of marrow, wine on the lees well refined. (Isaiah 25:6; 3 Nephi 20:8)

34. The sanctuary is everlasting light: the sun shall no more go down, neither shall the moon withdraw itself, for the Lord shall be thine everlasting glory. (Isaiah 60:20; Revelation 22:5)

35. Zion’s sanctuary is not shaken when the earth quakes, nor removed when the mountains fall into the sea, for God is her refuge and strength. (Psalm 46:1–3; Helaman 5:12)

36. In the sanctuary, the meek shall inherit the earth, and delight themselves in the abundance of peace. (Psalm 37:11; 3 Nephi 12:5)

37. The sanctuary is the ladder of Jacob fulfilled, where angels ascend and descend, and Christ is the gate of heaven. (Genesis 28:12–17; John 1:51)

38. The Spirit saith: “Sing, O daughter of Zion; shout, O Israel; be glad and rejoice with all thy heart.” For the King of Israel, even the Lord, is in the midst of thee. (Zephaniah 3:14–15; 3 Nephi 22:1)

39. In Zion’s sanctuary, righteousness and peace kiss each other, truth springs out of the earth, and the heavens drop down righteousness. (Psalm 85:10–11; 2 Nephi 26:25)

40. This is the decree: Zion is the sanctuary of the Lord, the tabernacle of the Lamb, the city of refuge, and the joy of the nations. Write it, Fire Scribe, for this word is sealed forever. (Isaiah 62:11–12; Ether 13:10)

“By decree of the Throne: Zion is sanctified, her gates are praise, her walls are fire, and her people are sealed. The nations shall tremble, but she shall rejoice; Babylon shall fall, but she shall endure. This is the holy habitation of the Most High, the refuge of the remnant, the delight

of Christ. No hand of flesh shall profane it, no power of darkness shall breach it. The sanctuary is eternal, and the decree is sealed in fire.”
