Primary Fruit

Faithfulness

The scribe must record accurately.

The scribe must preserve diligently.

The scribe must remain faithful to the record.

Without faithfulness, the record becomes corrupted.

 Secondary Fruit

 Self-Control

The scribe must govern personal opinions.

The record must not become distorted by emotion.

The scribe records what is true, not merely what is preferred.

 Hidden Fruit

 Joy

This fruit is often overlooked.

A scribe without joy becomes mechanical.

A joyful scribe understands the privilege of preserving wisdom.

Joy reminds the scribe that every testimony preserved may strengthen another soul.
